Dubuque Rescue Mission

The Dubuque rescue mission continues to serve the community of those misplaced.

The mission statement is as follows:

In the name of Jesus, the Dubuque Rescue Mission is a community offering Hospitality, Spiritual Hope, Food, Shelter, Clothing, and Job Skill Development to those in need.

This past year we have served 46,799 meals, which is an average of 3,899 meals a month. This is up 3,960 meals from the previous year.

We have provided bed space for countless numbers. Our main dorms have been full with 30 beds available, our warming shelter can house 20 men per night. Then we have our transitional houses that have 12 men total living there.

Our warming shelter, located at 1598 Jackson Street celebrated its one-year anniversary in March. This ministry has been a huge success.

This summer we hope to have the space open to organizations to help those misplaced find housing, jobs, health care needs and other items that may arise.

We always want to make sure that we thank the many volunteers who make this all possible and the wonderful support of the community and congregations in the area who provide financial support.

If you are ever interested in volunteering or perhaps you have a skill you think could be of service to the mission, please stop in and introduce yourself and tell us how you can help. Blessings!



Ministry to Migrants on the U.S. / Mexico Border

May 16th at 6:30 P.M. in Westminster Sanctuary Pastor Dan Emmert will tell of the mission trip he went on in November 2023 to the U.S. / Mexico border with 11 Iowa Presbyterians. Dan will tell of his experience, show slides, and explain what Christian churches are doing to minister to migrants while doing faithful community building across international borders.

Welcoming Refugees

June 13th at 6:30 P.M. in Westminster Sanctuary A panel will tell of local and statewide efforts and challenges to welcoming and supporting refugees and migrants from Ukraine, Afghanistan, Central and South America and around the world. Alex Baum - Dubuque Foundation representative will tell of Dubuque efforts and plans to welcome migrants and refugees to Dubuque.

Israel, Palestine, Gaza, and the Church

July 11th at 6:30 P.M. in Westminster Sanctuary

Amgad Beblawi will discuss the Israel-Hamas war and the church's response. Amgad is one of three Executive Presbyters for the Presbyteries of North Central Iowa, Des Moines, and Prospect Hill, and previously served as coordinator of the PC(USA)'s mission partnerships in Europe and the Middle East. He recently returned from a Presbyterian delegation to Palestine-Israel which will be part of his report.

HELP RELIGHT THE CENTENNIAL CROSS IN KEY WEST



HISTORY of the CROSS

The Centennial Cross was constructed in 1937 to commemorate the Centennial of the Archdiocese of Dubuque. The blue cross overlooks Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Key West, IA - just South of Dubuque. It has been a symbol of Christian faith for over 8 decades!

For many years after its construction the Cross was visible for miles outside of Dubuque and served as an evening beacon to travelers entering Dubuque and folks returning home. Over the years trees have grown tall enough to block the lights on the Cross making it hard to see. In addition, the Cross's neon bulbs are fragile and break easily from wind and driving rainstorms.


OUR PLAN

A not-for-profit organization has been formed and Centennial Cross Incorporated is devoted to refurbishing, lighting and maintaining the Cross for future generations. The plan is to pour a new concrete footing and erect a new steel cross that is 137' tall with LED lighting on z

sides. * The total budget for this project is \$350,000. Conlon Construction has been hired as the general contractor and work has begun.
