I encourage you to attend the Holy Week services. "To me, attending the Easter service without attending the Holy Week services is like watching the happy ending of the movie without seeing the middle—you only rob yourself of joy."

"What is a Seder Service?"

Seder is the traditional Passover Week Dinner celebrated by the Hebrews since the Exodus. It is the Hebrew Thanksgiving, giving thanks to God for deliverance and redemption.

Seder is that famous Dinner called The Last Supper, hosted by Jesus for His disciples. It is probable, based on The Gospels, to assume that Jesus celebrated every Seder of His life in Jerusalem. Seder, as the setting for Jesus' Last Supper, was the event Jesus choose to announce The New Covenant. And it was at this Seder that Jesus asked all of us to *do this in remembrance of Him.*

The Seder dinner is as Christian as it is Jewish. It is the focal point where we bring together our common heritage. We, as Christians, are heirs of Abraham through Faith and children of God through Christ.

Seder was the basis of the early Church's Lord's Day worship service. Eucharist is a transliteration of the Greek word which means to give thanks to God.

"What is a Tenebrae Service?"

The word 'tenebrae' is Latin for shadows. The purpose of the Tenebrae service is to recreate the emotional aspects of the passion story - to recreate the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the events, and it is left unfinished, because the story isn't over until Easter Day. So this is not supposed to be a happy service, because the occasion is not happy. If your expectation of Christian worship is that it should always be happy and exhilarating, you won't appreciate this service until the second time you attend it.

Mission Board Lenten Sharing - Hygiene Kits for Earthquake victims in Haiti

Supplying Hygiene Kits to the struggling families in Haiti is Immanuel's special Lenten sharing project. A kit will include

- One hand towel measuring approx. 16 x 28 (no fingertip or bath towels)
 - One washcloth
 - · One wide-tooth comb
 - · One nail clipper
 - One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
 - · Six standard size Band-Aids
 - One tooth brush (in original packaging) No toothpaste.

(<u>Note</u>: Cartons of toothpaste with an extended expiration date will be added to the kits just prior to shipment).

A box is located in the church entryway to drop off your donated items. Our church school youth will collect and separate the items each Sunday during Lent.

If you prefer donating cash, it will be most welcomed to cover the cost of shipping the kits. Merely mark your cash donation for Hygiene Kits. Church World Service will distribute the kits in Haiti.

Mission Board 2010 "Souper Bowl" - Another Great Success

The Board also extends a "special thanks" to Karen Candee for donating and preparing the soup for the meal as well as to all who donated food and other items to make this event a great success.

What a wonderful way to enjoy a day – attending worship service, the "pre-game party" in the gym, and watching the game later in the evening while sharing your donations of soup and dollars to feed the hungry in the community. Again "thanks" – you made the Food Pantry the big winner!

We are checking to find out what replacement costs would be for our furnaces. This was requested by the Visioning Committee for future reference.

Thank you to Rob Goedert who will be cutting the spare pews that were found under the stage to the desired lengths for the people who bought them. The sale of these raised \$292 for the general budget. If you feel that it is too cold in the sanctuary during worship, please let a member of the board know and we will see what we can do to adjust the temperature.

The Finance Board and the Diaconate will be sponsoring the Prime Rib Dinner on Friday, May 7. The menu will consist of Prime Rib, Baked Potato, Vegetable, Tossed Salad and Dessert. Chicken breast will be available on request when the ticket is purchased. Tickets will go on sale the middle of March for \$15 each. You must have a ticket and there will be seating for 135.


