

# From the Moderator Cindy Robles

Many of you may be wondering what has been going on since we voted to yoke with St. Matthew. The Bridge Committee, which was formed to work with members of St. Matthew on how the yoking process would proceed, has been meeting every two weeks to discuss the process. At our most recent meeting, we were made aware that when the members of St. Matthew took their vote on yoking, the actual vote was to "explore the idea" of yoking. Therefore, they will be working with us on what the process might be to yoke and will then make their final decision in September. The process we will use is to begin doing some joint visioning with the two churches committees, councils and finally the congregations. We will be setting up two opportunities for brainstorming and visioning over the summer months. The committee will be looking for ways that members will see opportunities for combining programs

and identify areas we want to keep separate from one another. The hope is to end the process with a joint Church profile and our desires for the type of Pastor we are looking for. We should also be able to see how this will affect us financially. The goal will be to complete the visioning process by September to allow St. Matthew the opportunity to make their final vote. The next step would then be to form a joint call/search committee in order to begin the process of hiring our yoked Pastor. This is an exciting time for both of our congregations. We have set some very exciting goals that we want to share in our visioning process and God is really showing us how there are so many opportunities for spiritual growth in the process. Look for the dates and who will be the likely persons to attend the visioning sessions. ALL are welcome, regardless of the topic of discussion.

# **Just4theBoys**

If you have seen some activity in the gym on Monday evenings, it is "Just4theBoys" - a local development group of young boys ages 5 – 18 from the downtown community. The goal is to help train and develop young men to be productive members of the Dubuque community. Group leader Larry Jackson, Jr. MSE has expressed appreciation for usage of our facilities which lends well to their needs. Immanuel is also pleased to provide our facility's usage for this development program as part of our community outreach.

In addition to the facility usage, Larry is in need of several items for the group meetings including food items, (e.g. pizza, juice, etc), Bibles for spiritual development, chess boards as part of teaching strategy and focus. Larry is in the process of developing the specifics of the needed items as a means of aiding our member's in their donations.

## **Karen Candee Ordination**

After her graduation, and approval for ordination by the division on ministry, it won't be long until Karen is "called" to a position and then ordained!

As an ordination gift we would like to make her a stole from the fabric of the congregation. This way she will take you with her wherever she is a minister. It will be somewhat like Pastor Sue's blue/purple stole which she wears during Advent and Lent (this was an ordination present to her made from pieces of fabric from her home church).

We would like to collect pieces of fabric (just one per person) that have green, blue, or purple in them. They can also be solids in those colors. The size can be from as small as a playing card to as large as a sheet of typing paper (8½ x 11). The best would be if this was cut from an actual piece of clothing that you used to wear (perhaps Karen would even recognize it) but if not that then something appropriate from your scrap basket or the fabric store. Please put your fabric in an envelope with your name on the outside. It will be fun and meaningful for Karen to be able to identify the people she wears on her stole!

## **Christian Education Board**

# Lenten Sharing - Hygiene Kits for Earthquake victims in Haiti

On Saturday morning April 17 approximately twenty-five adults and youth gathered to package personal hygiene items donated during the Lenten sharing season for shipment to the earthquake victims in Haiti. A total of 75 hygiene kits were packaged. In the meantime our neighboring St. Matthew Lutheran Church learning of the project has made an appeal to their members to participate in this outreach project. Consequently, an additional quantity beyond the original 75 kits will be shipped to Haiti. A "special thanks" is extended to all who donated the items, monies to cover the shipments, and helped with the packaging; and to our friends at St. Matthew for joining in this project.

# **Habitat for Humanity**

During the summer months Immanuel as a "covenant congregation" once again will be supporting the local efforts of Habitat for Humanity. Contributions will be collected **during June, July and August.** Containers, resembling miniature houses, will be located in the entryway of the sanctuary for individuals and families to take home and place their coins and dollars throughout the month for bringing to church the <u>first Sunday of the following month – July 4, August 1 and September 5.</u> During last year's three-month appeal \$237.00 was contributed through the miniature house collection as part of the designated envelope offering throughout the year's total of \$498.04, which went toward the completion of the home at 1112 Roosevelt Street for a single mother and five children. <u>Your contributions do make</u> a difference!

## **Finance Board**

The Finance/Trustee board has been busy handling the building and financial responsibilities of Immanuel. We are doing quite well financially and with the continued support of the membership we should be able to have a successful year.

We thank all of you who helped with the cleaning and freshening up of the sanctuary. We also updated the electrical outlets around the organ. The entryway windows will be cleaned before the May 7 dinner. The guys also cleaned the parking lot drains of debris. We are working with the Diaconate on the Prime Rib Dinner and hope you have your ticket. We are looking to have a fun and tasty evening May 7.

The major item handled at our April meeting was that we voted to accept the bid from Advantage to replace the two (2) furnaces that service the sanctuary with high efficiency furnaces for the amount of \$4500 installed. These furnaces will increase the

efficiency from about 70% to 93%. We feel this will help with our heating bills in the winter months. Several members have made special donations to help with this expense. If you would like to help with the furnace fund, please put it in the offering plate and mark it "Furnace Fund". Any amount will be greatly appreciated.
